TROPICAL STORM ALBERTO

The National Hurricane Center issued the following tropical Storm Warning at 7:00 am this morning.

A Tropical Storm Warning is in effect for...

- the Texas coast from Port O'Connor southward to the mouth of the Rio Grande
- the northeastern coast of Mexico south of the mouth of the Rio Grande to Puerto de Altamira.

A Tropical Storm Warning means that tropical storm conditions are expected somewhere within the warning area within 36 hours.

Alberto is now tracking north at about 6 mph with winds of 40mph. Specific storm surge warnings have been issued for:

- Sargent, TX to Sabine Pass, TX...2-4 ft
- Galveston Bay...2-4 ft
- Mouth of the Rio Grande, TX to Sargent, TX...1-3 ft
- Sabine Pass, TX to Vermilion/Cameron Parish Line, LA...1-3 ft

Heavy rain is also expected in those areas along with some storm surge and tropical storm wind conditions. Hurricane hunter aircraft have been out and will continue their surveillance.
