Normally, we would refrain from sending out an Alert this early, however, the storm could be impacting areas of the Texas Gulf Coast as early as Sunday morning on this long holiday weekend.

As of this morning, Hurricane Beryl remains a strong Category 4 hurricane with sustained winds at 145 mph just southwest of Jamaica. Beryl is expected to reach the Yucatan Peninsula early Friday morning and weaken into a tropical storm while over land. Once the storm passes through the peninsula, it is expected to gain strength and reestablish as a hurricane in the Gulf of Mexico.

Keep an eye on the Gulf. Activate and review your Emergency Action Plan for Tropical Storms/Hurricanes. The National Hurricane Center is forecasting a path that could impact a large area of the Mexican and Texas coastline. Monitor your local news and bulletins from the National Weather Service. Don't hesitate to call the Fund's Risk Control Consultants for additional information about preparations.
